For example, our ... brothers and sisters in Christ often live in profoundly difficult situations. Many flee their homeland in search of safety and a better life to live in Thailand.

Through the ministry of Rhema Thailand, and the graduates of RBTCT, both those living within ... and those displaced living in Thailand, are hearing the Gospel, and being taught the life changing Word of God.

The graduates of our ... extension campus are circumventing obstacles to reach their neighbors and communities, by sharing the good news of Jesus and meeting in homes.

Within the borders of Thailand, several of our graduates are ministering to people who have immigrated here from ... (not just ethnic ..., but minority hill



tribe groups as well). Some are located in boarder towns, others reside here in Bangkok.

Rhema Thailand is reaching these people too. One of our church members provided facilities at his factory which employs 2000 or so people, many of whom are immigrants from Since March 2009, teams of volunteers, including church members, student & alumni, have been ministering the Good News and love of Jesus there every week.

Thank you for praying for us as we traveled to the USA. We were really on the go this time visiting 9 different locations, some places several times. After 31 days of travel, we changed locations 16 times before finally settling down back home in Bangkok.
