## **... OF ALL NATIONS**



When we came to Thailand in 1991, making disciples was 1 of 4 keys points in our vision. The other 3: evangelism, church planting, & leadership training. While Thailand has been our host nation and primary focus, other nations of SE Asia have also been in our sites.



Making disciples can take place in many different forms: in a formal or a non-formal setting, one-on-one, in small groups or large, such as church or Bible school(s). Whenever and wherever you can reach peoples' hearts, you can make disciples.



Discipleship is as much about learning truths as it is about learning to live by those truths. The perfect example comes from Jesus, the great disciple maker, who taught truths using life stories. Who does not understand the story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37), that we each are a neighbor to everyone we encounter in life. Even after 20 years here, it still surprises people when we use an example from their culture to explain the Bible. The Bible is international, and relevant to all cultures no matter what language it is printed in.
